Deutsch Endorsed by Congressional Candidate Sean Duffy

(Rice Lake, WI) – “Northern Wisconsin needs a new voice in the Wisconsin State Senate, and a new perspective of how to create jobs, balance a budget, and protect our fundamental rights; in order to achieve that, northern Wisconsin needs Dane Deutsch,” said Sean Duffy, 7th Congressional District candidate, as he announced his endorsement of Dane Deutsch for the 25th Senate District.

The 25th State Senate district includes all of Douglas, Bayfield, Ashland, Iron, Washburn counties and parts of Sawyer, Barron, Polk and Burnett counties. Deutsch believes the district deserves better representation from someone who is in touch with the issues of the day, at both levels of government.

“Sean is a part of a growing movement to end the status quo in Washington D.C., and I hope to do the same in Madison – I’m excited for our tandem efforts to bring fiscal sanity back to state and federal government, and welcome his support and endorsement” said Deutsch.

Not unlike Congressional Democrats, Deutsch says Democrats in the State Legislature have played fast and loose with the taxpayers’ money and driving businesses to the brink of extinction. Deutsch is concerned with the surge in public sector, government jobs while private sector companies are laying off workers, or closing up shop.

“It’s completely unsustainable; government cannot continue to grow at the expense of taxpayers and local businesses. Without private sector support, the public sector should not be able to expand year after year, but unfortunately, long-time, status quo lawmakers like Bob Jauch believe it can and must,” Deutsch said. “We need to reverse that trend.”

Deutsch believes the people of the 25th Senate District are fed up with lawmakers who have spent decades spending and legislating away their future and freedoms. Duffy agrees and says this year will be a pivotal moment in state and national politics, as voters are eager for a change in course.

“The Seventh Congressional district and the 25th Senate District have been represented for a long time by career politicians and it’s time for some outsiders to step in,” Duffy said. “Dane and I are prepared to bring a new vision to both state and federal government and usher a new generation of representative democracy.”

“Putting people back to work and getting Wisconsin’s economy moving again is going to require fresh ideas and decisive action. It will also require the cooperation of the Wisconsin Legislature and the United States Congress working towards a common goal of fiscal responsibility and government accountability,” Deutsch concluded. “I look forward to working with Sean to meet those goals, and appreciate his support of my candidacy to do likewise in the Wisconsin State Senate.”
